
#### **STAFF FAREWELL**


#### **SCHOOL FACEBOOK**

We are excited to announce that Tangaroa College has an official Facebook page. This will be a convenient way to stay up to date with what is happening in and around the school, including up coming events or changes.




#### **FAMILY FUN DAY STALLS**
